Establishing Culturally Sensitive Professional and Supportive Relationship with Iranian Clients (Repeat)

Presenter: Faye Hezar, Psy.D.

Description: Cultural competence is a set of academic and interpersonal skills that allow an individual to increase their understanding and appreciation of cultural differences and similarities within, among and between groups. This 3-hour training has been designed to assist clinicians to incorporate the cultural perspective into the course of treatment in order to facilitate mindful treatment that is both effective and culturally appropriate for Iranian American Clients.

Objectives:

- To become familiar and have an understanding of Iranian culture and traditions.
- To learn basic fundamental skills on engaging, building trust, and establishing relationships with Iranian clients.
- To apply treatment strategies that are relevant while culturally appropriate for this population.

About the presenter: Faye (Fariba) Hezar was born in Iran and graduated from high school in Iran prior to moving to the United States in 1978. She holds a doctorate in clinical psychology from American Behavioral Institute. Ms. Hezar completed her internship at the OMID Institute (a private practice facility in Irvine), IMCES Institute for multicultural counseling and educational services in Los Angeles and in various domestic violence shelters in Orange County. In addition, she is a certified instructor for parent-training classes for foster and adoptive parents. Dr. Hezar has been extremely active in both the Iranian and the American community. She is a founding board member of the Iranian Recovery Center, a non-profit organization, and has held positions as president, secretary and treasurer. Dr. Hezar is a member of the Iranian-American Psychological Association and the Orange County Psychological Association. She has organized and presented educational workshops on the topics of drug and alcohol addiction and prevention in the Iranian community. In addition, Dr. Hezar has translated various informational materials from English to Farsi in order to educate and assist the Farsi speaking population in the United States.

- 2. Describe why changes in memory assessment
- 3. Articulate some basic psychometric properties of WAIS-IV
- 4. Practice scoring and interpretation strategies using the WAIS-IV and WMA-IV

Dr. Gabel is the Training and Client Consultation Director with Pearson Clinical Assessment. She earned her Ph.D. and MS in school psychology from Pennsylvania State University. Her specialty is the comprehensive evaluation of preschool and school-aged students. Dr. Gabel has previously served as a clinical supervisor for the George Mason University Gifted and Talented Clinic and adjunct instructor for the University of Virginia and George Washington University. She has provided training workshops both nationally and internationally on topics, including linking assessment to effective teaching, AD/HD, reading disorders/literacy, executive function disorders, and a variety of assessment and intervention methodologies. UCLA Integrated Substance Abuse Programs (UCLA-ISAP) and the Orange County Health Care Agency (OCHCA) are providing full-day training on trauma and co-occurring disorders (COD). This complimentary training will focus on the unique role of trauma in the development of substance use disorders. Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) will be emphasized, and motivational interviewing will be discussed as a technique for engaging patients and facilitating behavior change.

Providers are invited to attend <u>one</u> of the two trainings listed below (identical curriculum):

At the conclusion of the training, participants will be able to:

- 1. Understand the role of trauma and other psychosocial risk factors in the development of substance use disorders and psychiatric comorbidity in adult and adolescent populations.
- 2. Understand the environmental, parental and familial factors that both contribute to and ameliorate co-occurring disorders, and identify skills to engage the family system.
- 3. Identify principles and techniques of Motivational Interviewing that may be used to engage and facilitate change in substance-using patients.
