Orange County had a population of 1,989,178 adults between the ages of 18 and 64 in Fiscal Year 2013-2014*. The population increased by 2.4% from Fiscal Year (FY) 2010/11 TO 2013/14, and a further increase of 1.2% is projected from FY 2013/14 to 2016/17. SSA provided one or more types of services and assistance to approximately 1 out of every 7 adult residents of the County in June 2014.
