


Site Information

- Opened in 1960
- Owned and operated by the County of Orange
- Accepts non-hazardous, municipal solid waste from commercial and self haulers (Class III Sanitary Landfill).
- Maximum permitted daily refuse is 8,000 tons
- Approximately 565 acres with about 420 acres to be used for waste disposal
- Converts landfill gas to energy.
- Anticipated to stop accepting waste in 2030.

General Information

History

North Region

The Olinda Alpha Landfill has a two-part name. The original landfill opened in 1960 and was named Olinda Landfill, after the canyon in which it is located, the Olinda Canyon.

Alpha came to be part of the name because of two canyons located next to the Olinda Landfill. These were know as Canyon A and Canyon B, and were referred to by site staff as Alpha and Beta. When the landfill expanded into Canyon A in 1981the landfill was renamed Olinda Alpha Landfill.

Environmental Protection

Olinda Alpha Landfill has a network of proactive environmental programs and control systems to prevent any potential impacts to the areas surrounding it:

- Hazardous waste control program.
- Landfill gas monitoring, recovery, and control system and landfill gas to energy plant, which produces approximately 38 megawatts of electricity.
- Groundwater monitoring, extraction, and treatment and collection system.
- Leachate collection and recovery system.
- Radioactive waste observation program.
- Erosion, fire, dust, insect, rodent, bird, noise, and litter control systems.

OC Waste & Recycling works cooperatively with regulators to ensure the landfill operates in full compliance with all Federal, State, and Local codes, ordinances, and regulations.



The landfill is subject to regular inspections from the California Integrated Waste Management Board and the Board's local enforcement agency, the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, and the South Coast Air Quality Management District to ensure compliance with all applicable regulations.
