

Programs and Initiatives

Early Learning Programs

Early learning programs ignite a love for reading while fostering creativity and skill development through engaging and enriching experiences for children and their families. Storytimes introduce young readers to the joy of books while strengthening family bonds with interactive crafts and activities that build cognitive and motor skills. Stay and Play encourages learning through play, sparking curiosity and independence, while connecting parents and caregivers in a supportive network.

The award-winning **Kindergarten Readiness Initiative**, highlighted by the popular **Kinderpalooza** event, equips young learners for school with resources like parent instruction for school readiness skills, educational toys, read-along books, and bilingual computer stations—making early learning engaging, fun, and accessible both at the library and at home. These programs empower children with the tools for lifelong success while fostering strong family and community connections.





After-School Programs & Homework Help

After-school programs offer children a safe, supportive space to connect with peers while engaging in creative and educational activities, including book clubs, crafts, and STEAM projects. In addition, our Homework Help services provide students with free access to online tutoring in subjects like math, reading, writing, science, and social studies, ensuring they have the support they need to succeed academically. Together, these programs foster creativity, learning, and social development, helping children thrive both inside and outside the classroom.



Year-Round Reading Programs

OC Public Libraries is dedicated to fostering literacy, learning, and community connections throughout the year with programs designed to motivate readers of all ages.

Summer at the Library remains a cherished tradition, offering families a fun and educational escape while combating the "summer slide." Through storytimes, crafts, author visits, performances, and interactions with beloved book characters, the program inspires a love of reading and learning. The **Summer Reading Challenge** engages kids and teens with reading logs, prizes, and exciting events, empowering them to dream big and see themselves represented in literature. In 2024, OCPL served over 18,000 meals through Lunch at the Library, promoting health and wellness while connecting families to vital resources.

Beyond summer, OCPL offers **year-round reading initiatives** to engage both reluctant and avid readers. Seasonal programs and incentive-based challenges make reading a fun, rewarding experience for all, building confidence and curiosity across all age groups. These programs are more than just activities—they're a celebration of books, learning, and the power of community connection.



Empowering Teens

We are dedicated to meeting the unique needs of teens, providing dynamic programs and spaces where they can learn, grow, and connect.

Through **Teen Advisory Boards** and **Teen Volunteer Programs**, teens develop critical life skills like leadership, collaboration, and problem-solving. These opportunities empower them to make a difference in their communities while offering a welcoming space to connect with friends, work on homework, and explore activities tailored to their interests.



Supporting Adults and Seniors

OC Public Libraries is committed to empowering adults and seniors with a wide range of cultural, creative, and educational programs that foster lifelong learning and reduce social isolation. From engaging cultural events and author visits to cooking classes focused on healthy eating, our dynamic offerings provide opportunities for personal growth, skill-building, and socializing.



TeenFest offered a dynamic mix of experiences that combined preparation for the future with opportunities for fun and connection. Teens participated in career-advice sessions, creative workshops, author talks, and financial literacy classes, alongside engaging programs like Adulting 101 covering topics from voting to life skills. TeenFest created an exciting and supportive environment where teens could learn, grow, and enjoy themselves.

These programs not only enhance cognitive health and well-being, but they also create vibrant spaces for adults and seniors to connect, build relationships, and engage with others across generations. Through activities like technology classes, book clubs, creative workshops, and cultural appreciation events, we ensure that every program contributes to reducing isolation, promoting health, and strengthening community bonds throughout the year. Whether it's learning new skills, enjoying a meal together, or simply connecting with others, the library is a vital space for growth and connection.

At **Comic Orange**, teens immersed themselves in the world of graphic novels, animation, and cosplay. This vibrant festival featured drawing workshops, career panels, escape rooms, life-sized games, and an artist alley highlighting local talent. Teens had the unique chance to interact with authors, creators, and fellow fans, sparking creativity and building community.







Nurturing Literacy, Inspiring Learning

OC READ & Families for Literacy

OC Public Libraries is committed to empowering adults and families through programs that enhance literacy and create opportunities for personal and academic growth. **OC READ** offers essential tutoring for English-speaking adults looking to improve their reading and writing skills. By providing personalized support, this program helps learners gain the confidence to achieve personal, family, and career milestones—whether it's reading to their children, understanding the newspaper, or securing employment.

Families for Literacy works to break the cycle of intergenerational low literacy by empowering parents to become their child's first teacher.



Through one-on-one tutoring and workshops, parents gain the tools to actively support their child's education, from communicating with teachers to understanding school reports and navigating school registration. Together, these programs foster a love of learning that benefits both adults and children, ensuring success for the whole family and setting a foundation for lifelong achievement.

Career Online High School

Since its inception, Career Online High School has empowered 71 adults to earn an accredited high school diploma, with many graduates reporting career advancements or continuing their education in higher learning. This life-changing program offers flexible, online learning, supported by personalized coaching and instruction to ensure each student's success. Graduates not only gain valuable career skills, but many also use their achievement as motivation to encourage their children to pursue their own educational goals. Career Online High School is not just about earning a diploma—it's about transforming lives and creating new opportunities for their future success.









Books at the Core: The Heart of Our Mission

Books are more than just stories—they are the heart of everything we do. They connect us across generations, cultures, and experiences, fueling our passion for creating accessible, engaging programs that bring people together. The recent revitalization of the Los Alamitos-Rossmoor Library is an example of the renovation program, featuring energy-efficient upgrades, ADA-compliant enhancements, and redesigned areas such as a new teen space and reservable study rooms. These improvements make our libraries more accessible, inviting, and functional for all visitors.

We will continue revitalization work, ensuring that our libraries remain vibrant centers of learning, creativity, and community. By combining innovative services, engaging programs, and modernized environments, we reaffirm our commitment to making OC Public Libraries the heart of community—where everyone can gather, learn, and thrive.
















Stronger Communities Through Partnerships
